St. Philip's Welcomes Father Steve Hines



We are delighted to be welcoming The Reverend Steve Hines to St. Philip's for a period of six (6) months beginning May 1st through October 31, 2022!

Fr. Steve was born into an Episcopal family. His father was a Presiding Bishop from 1965-1974. He also has two (2) brothers who are Episcopal Priests. Fr. Steve is 72 years old and was born in Austin, Texas. He was educated at St. Stephen's Episcopal Church, Hobart College, and the Episcopal Church of the Southwest. After working in Austin and Houston, Fr. Steve moved to North Carolina in 1982. He served as a missionary in Haiti, teaching at the Episcopal seminary there from 1990-1991. Fr. Steve has been retired for 15 years after serving 30 years of ministry in the Episcopal Church. He

has worked in churches in Cashiers, NC; Asheville, NC; and was Interim in Highlands, NC; Hattiesburg, MS; and Lincolnnton, NC, as well as, serving as Interim at Trinity, Danville, KY from 2006-2007, and then again from 2020-2021.

Holy Week and Easter Services



Come Worship With Us!

April 10, Palm Sunday, 10 a.m.~ Fr. Cliff Pike: Beginning of Holy Week

To commemorate the day Jesus entered into Jerusalem, palm fronds will be distributed and the congregation will process around the church pews twice before returning to our seats. The Interactive Gospel will be used during the service.

April 14, Thursday, 6:30 p.m.: Maundy Thursday~Fr. Cliff Pike: This service commemorates Jesus' Last Supper with his disciples. Following the prayer of Thanksgiving, Altar Guild members silently remove all items from the altar area leaving it bare. The congregation leaves in silence.

April 15, Friday, 6:30 p.m.: Good Friday Liturgy~Fr. Cliff Pike: This is the memorial of Christ's crucifixion and is the one day in the church year when Eucharist is not celebrated.

April 17, Sunday, 10 a.m.: Easter Day Service celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ! ~Bishop Larry Maze: Easter Story and Egg Hunt for youth follows the service.

Flowers needed for the Easter Day Cross: People wishing to contribute flowers for the Flowering of the Cross are asked to bring them to the church on Saturday or by 9:45 on Easter Sunday. **There will be a bucket with water on the front porch of the church if you want to drop off on Saturday.**

March Vestry Meeting Highlights

The Vestry held the March meeting on the 20th.

The following is a list of the business that was covered:

1. **Vicki presented information regarding Fr. Steve Hines and his upcoming time at St. Philip's.** The terms of the letter of agreement with Fr. Steve that needs diocesan approval was discussed.
2. The vestry suggested having a meeting (along with the worship committee and vergers) with Fr. Steve on Saturday, April 2nd at 4 p.m., followed by a meal. **
3. Vicki reported that the housing arrangements for Fr. Steve would be a rental for \$1000 a month. This includes utilities and furnishings. The vestry approved the rental terms.
4. **The "Meet and Greet" Spaghetti lunch was discussed.** A sign-up sheet was requested to help in adequate food preparation.
5. Melanie requested St. Philip's sponsor a gift basket for the St. George's Day Youth scholarship silent auction. The basket is themed around the St. Philip's "Recipes from the Heart" Cookbook with local and cooking items.

** **The vestry, vergers and worship committee members met with Fr. Steve on April 2nd.** The vergers met at 3:15 p.m. in the church to show Fr. Steve around. The vestry and worship committee joined the group for a meeting and a meal at 4 p.m. in the Parish Hall. Fr. Steve shared about his life and background. The group also discussed the future of St. Philip's and the need for a plan and visibility in the community.
